**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 1124 expands the scope of the zone of safety restrictions and residency restrictions which are applied to persons subject to the provisions of the Sex Offender Registration Act to include the residence of the victim. The person subject to the restrictions is prohibited from loitering within 1,000 feet of the residence of the victim.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure widens the scope of a felony. The actual fiscal impact is contingent upon how many individuals are convicted of the crime. The current average incarceration costs for an individual in DOC custody is \$52.90/day or \$19,309.70/year.
