**Research Analysis**

HB 1192 allows for the use of dogs when hunting game, except bear, elk, antelope, and turkey. The measure includes limitations when hunting deer with dogs: It requires a \$5 license, restricts the dog breed to beagles or beagle mix, and limits the timeframe to the last seven days of the deer-hunting season.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1192, as introduced, will contain a \$5 fee from the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation (DWC). A minimal revenue increase is expected, however, any revenue generated would be offset by law enforcement costs associated with regulating deer hunting dogs.
