**Research Analysis**

HB 1280 modifies the powers of the Construction Industries Board (CIB). The measure authorizes the CIB to:

- operate an informational website;
- enter into contracts with Career Tech for programs providing electrical, plumbing, mechanical, or roofing trade instruction; and
- transfer funds from certain licensure revolving funds to a separate workforce development fund to be used for instructional purposes.

**Fiscal Analysis**

Creation of the Skilled Trade Education and Workforce Development Fund and permitting fine revenue transfers thereto will not significantly impact state revenues. According to the Construction Industries Board, fine revenue that is currently being used for administration of other specific licensing and registration acts will be transferred for the purpose increasing awareness and training in certain trades, but such transfers are not going to adversely impact the agency's general operations.
