**Research Analysis**

HB 1283 adjusts licensure requirements for building inspectors. An applicant must show successful completion of an examination, and have been employed by a political subdivision. The measure provides that licenses, except for two-year provisional license, are to be issued for one year and expire on the licensee's birth date. Finally, the bill allows for license renewal if the inspector is not employed at the time of renewal, as long as all other requirements are met, the application reflects the change in employment, and the application includes a request to renew in inactive status.
