**Other Considerations**

Commercial disposal wells fall under the jurisdiction of the OCC's Oil and Gas Conservation Division (OGDC). The OGDC implements rules requiring commercial saltwater disposal wells to maintain a record of volumes disposed, and a voucher reporting the entity generating the waste and its origin, which is reported semi-annually. Meters are not required; however, most operators want the wells to be metered to monitor disposal costs. Per the Oklahoma Corporation Commission, record keeping is not a strict definition for a chain of command, and rule modification consideration is recommended.
