The conference committee substitute to HB 1338 authorizes an inmate who is 50 years of age or older who is medically frail and is serving time for concealing stolen property, embezzlement, forgery in the first degree, burglary in the second degree or possession of a controlled substance to be considered for medical parole review.

Fiscal Analysis

The CCR A on HB 1338 does not negatively fiscally impact the state. However, if this measure increases the amount of inmates released early, this could reduce prison populations in the state: thereby reducing incarceration and medical costs. This savings is dependent upon the number of inmates released early by the Pardon and Parole Board.

According to the Dept. of Corrections (DOC), the average cost of medical expenses over a 6 month period for the following age groups are as follows:

Age Group	Cost per inmate (6 months)
50-59	\$1,080
70-79	\$2,116
80+	\$7,879

The DOC estimates that these medical costs paid by DOC would be significantly lowered if inmates in these age groups are able to be released early.
