Research Analysis

HB 1338 authorizes an inmate who is 50 years of age or older with a medical disability and is serving time for a nonviolent offense to be considered for medical parole review.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 1338, as introduced, does not negatively fiscally impact the state. However, if this measure increases the amount of inmates released early, this could reduce prison populations in the state thereby reducing incarceration and medical costs. This savings is dependent upon the number of inmates released early by the Pardon and Parole Board.

According to the Dept. of Corrections (DOC), the average cost of medical expenses over a 6 month period for the following age groups are as follows:

Age Group	Cost per inmate (6 months)
50-59	\$1,080
70-79	\$2,116
80+	\$7,879

The average cost of incarceration of one inmate in OKC DOC custody per day is \$52.24 or \$19,067.60 annually.

The DOC estimates that medical costs currently paid by DOC would be significantly lowered if inmates in these age groups are able to be released early. This would also reduce the overall number of incarcerated individuals in Oklahoma.
