**Fiscal Analysis**

The PCS 1 on HB 1472 establishes a misdemeanor for those who violate the new language with a penalty of imprisonment of up to 1 year in county jail and/or by a fine no less than \$1,000. The bill gives the Attorney General the ability to file a civil suit and seek damages of up to \$500 for each piece of content. The revenue generated by this new ability is dependent upon how many civil suits are won by the Attorney General.
