Research Analysis

The introduced measure removes the requirement for the Secretary of State to publish the subject matter standards in the same manner as agency rules. Additionally, it requires state assessments to be reviewed for alignment with subject matter standards the year after the standards are adopted, and it aligns the textbook adoption cycle with the standards adoption cycle. Lastly, it waives the deadline for preliminary and final assessment results to be provided to school districts in years where new cut scores are to be determined by the Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 1667, as introduced, relates to schools and subject matter standards and the statewide student assessment system. Language is included for the Department of Education instead of the Board to issue a request for proposals for the selection of assessments and the awarding of contracts. And, the six-year subject area textbook adoption cycle shall align to the subject matter standards adoption cycle. The measure has no fiscal impact.
