Research Analysis

HB 1680 adds a notification requirement to the Oklahoma Victim Information and notification Everyday (VINE) service. The measure requires the Department of Corrections to give notice of the date of release or date of anticipated release of the inmate to the designated Oklahoma service provider of the VINE service not less than 10 days prior to the release of the inmate. The Department may not release the inmate until notification has been received by the service provider. The measure provides that opinions of the Court of Criminal Appeals designated for official publication must also be published on the Oklahoma State Courts Network website and must provide notice to all interested parties of the appeal not less than 2 business days prior to publication. The measure requires the Department of Corrections, rather than the district attorney, to make notifications prior to the placement of an inmate on the Electronic Monitoring Program.

HB 1680, as introduced, has been reviewed by both agencies involved.
