Research Analysis

The CS requires school districts that adopt a four-day school week to submit a plan to the State Department of Education that outlines the following:

- The goals sought to be achieved by the change;
- The intended educational and fiscal benefits; and
- The anticipated impacts or outcomes of the change including any potential disadvantages.

The plan must be submitted by September 1 and is good for three years. Prior to the beginning of the third year, the school district must submit an updated plan to the department.

Fiscal Analysis

CS for HB 1684 provides for a school district that adopts a four-day school week and related rules will submit a specified plan to the State Board of Education no later than September 1. The plan will be for no longer than three years, and prior to the beginning of the third year, the school district will submit an updated plan. The measure has no fiscal impact.
