## **Research Analysis**

The CS for HB 1798 allows hunting of feral swine on private property, without a license, at night, with a vehicle and spotlight, while using night-vision equipment. The measure also allows for hunting of feral swine on public land without a license, except during deer gun season, and clarifies residency status of minors.

The measure repeals the special permit that is required for private property owners to kill/attempt to kill depredating feral swing during deer gun and primitive firearm season.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The measure as written, and, per the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation (ODWC), estimates approximately 5,115 feral hog hunters would be exempted from purchasing a deer firearms license when hunting hogs during the firearm season. Based on this estimate, ODWC anticipates an annual negative fiscal impact of \$102,300 to the state.
