Research Analysis

HB 1821 increases the minimum number of training hours for reserve special agents of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control (OBND) from 160 hours to 240 hours. The measure also provides that any employee of OBND in a classified position under the Merit System who is appointed Director, Deputy Director, Acting Director, or Acting Deputy Director has the right to return to the classified service without any loss of rights, privileges or benefits. The measure allows OBND to designate noncommissioned personnel as compliance inspectors to make administrative inspections of places where persons registered or exempted from registration are required to keep records.
