Fiscal Analysis

From the Tax Commission:

Under the proposal the current cigarette tax rate is modified as follows:

Packs of 20s – \$1.03 per pack to \$2.53 per pack

Packs of 25s – \$1.2875 per pack to \$2.7875 per pack

The Oklahoma Tax Commission – Revenue Forecast for FY 18 projects cigarette tax revenues of \$196,723,000 which equates to approximately 190,993,204 packs. Assuming a 10% reduction in consumption attributable to the rate increase yields a projected estimate of 171,893,884 cigarette packs sold. Applying the \$1.50 proposed increase to estimated pack sales would result in an increase in cigarette tax revenues of \$257,840,826.

HB 1841 proposes an effective date of September 1, 2017. For FY 18, the estimated increase in cigarette tax revenues is \$214,867,355 [$\$257,840,826 / 12 \text{ months} = \$21,486,736 \times 10 \text{ months} = \$214,867,355$]. For FY 19, the estimated increase in cigarette tax revenues is \$257,840,826.
