# **Fiscal Analysis**

The FA2 on HB 1845 adds language which distributes a portion of the fee from the across-the-board license/ID card increase of \$5.00. Under this amendment, the revenue will be distributed:

# For those motor agents that process REAL ID:

\$2.00 remains with the motor agent

\$3.00 deposited into the Dept. of Public Safety Revolving (200) Fund

## For those motor agents who decline to process REAL ID:

\$5.00 deposited into Dept. of Public Safety Revolving (200) Fund

This amendment does not increase license fees for those over age 65.

The actual revenue raised from the license fee increase, is dependent upon how many people receive licenses for the first time and how many are up for renewal each fiscal year. DPS has provided license statistics for calendar year 2016 below:

## Total driver license and ID cards issued: 1,128,424

Total were Class D: 932,975
Total were CDL 58,946
Total were ID cards 136,503

If one assumes all licenses issued are subjected to the \$5.00 increase, it can be estimated that the total revenue raised for the first year will be  $\sim$ \$5 million.

A portion of this revenue will be retained by motor agents, and a portion will go to DPS for REAL ID implementation.
