**Research Analysis**

The CS exempts from civil and criminal liability school districts and nonprofit organizations who receive a good-faith donation of food that is fit for human consumption at the time of the donation.

The measure permits school districts to donate food to a nonprofit organization through an authorized on-campus nonprofit representative or designee who is directly affiliated with the school as a teacher, counselor or PTA member. The food may be received, stored and redistributed at the school at any time, and school employees may assist in preparing and distributing the food as volunteers for the nonprofit organization.

**Fiscal Analysis**

CS for HB 1875 permits a school district to allow a school site to elect to donate food to a nonprofit organization as specified. Donated food may be redistributed on the school site. School employees may assist as volunteers for the nonprofit organization. Certain exemptions from liability are provided.

The measure is anticipated to have no fiscal impact.
