**Research Analysis**

The conference committee substitute for HB1925 modifies the boundaries of Oklahoma Supreme Court and Oklahoma Court of Criminal Appeals judicial districts effective November 1, 2017. For the Oklahoma Supreme Court, the new arrangement will include one justice from each of the five congressional districts as they exist on November 1, 2017 and four justices selected at large. For the Court of Criminal Appeals, one justice will be selected from each of the five congressional districts used to select Supreme Court justices.
