**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB1925 modifies the composition of Oklahoma Supreme Court beginning November 1, 2017. The new arrangement will include one justice from each of the five congressional districts and four justices selected at large. The measure requires 2 of the at-large justices to be selected from counties with a population of less than 75,000 people. In the event that redistricting changes the boundaries or number of congressional districts in the state, the composition of the OSC will remain at 9 justices, with one from each congressional district and the remainder to be selected at large.
