Research Analysis

The measure modifies the Aircraft Pilot and Passenger Protection Act. The bill specifies that surveying standards are to be made in accordance with the Federal Aviation Administration standards. The measure also amends the definition of *incompatible purpose* to include places of public assembly, transportation facilities, storage facilities, and aboveground utility facilities. Likewise, the measure amends *total-structure height* to specify the use of Federal Aviation Administration standards.

Further, the bill adds that no permit will be required for temporary structures that will be in place for less than 24 months. Furthermore, the measure increases the number of days, from 30 to 60, a permit applicant has to record an issued permit to the local county clerk. Finally, the measure provides the conditions under which a permittee may request to amend a permit.
