**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 2260 removes liability protections for any person, property owner, tenant, employer, holder of an event permit, place of worship or business entity that prohibits the carrying a loaded or unloaded, concealed or unconcealed weapon on property that the person, property owner, tenant, employer, holder of an event permit, place of worship or business entity owns, or has legal control. The measure clarifies that persons or entities that do allow for the carrying of firearms on their property are immune from liability arising from the carrying of weapons while in the scope of employment or in or about a business entity vehicle.
