Impact:	Reduces some sentences, possible savings for DOC

Research Analysis

The committee substitute to HB 2281 contains the Governor's Justice Reform Task Force recommendations relating to unlawful delivery of goods, false personation, credit or debit card crimes, forged instruments or coins, larceny of lost property, theft of aircraft, automobile or construction equipment and theft of a controlled dangerous substance. The measure creates graduated penalties based upon the value of the property.

Fiscal Analysis

The CS version of HB 2281 creates graduated penalties for certain crimes listed below:

Crime	If value of money/property/instrument is less than \$1,000	If value of money/property/instrument is between \$1,001 and \$2,500	If value of money/property/instrument is between \$2,501 and \$15,000	If value of money/property/instrument is more than \$15,000

The average daily cost of incarceration for one individual in the custody of DOC is \$52.24. This could potentially create cost savings. The amount of savings is contingent upon how many individuals are convicted and the length of the sentences.
