Fiscal Analysis

HB 2286 increases the potential for more inmates to be approved for parole including those inmates over the age of 60 which would generate a cost savings for the Dept. of Corrections. Currently the average cost of incarceration for one individual in DOC custody is \$58.70/day or \$21,425.50/year. Also, since this bill empowers to parole those inmates over 60, DOC estimates that their medical costs would decrease. The savings is contingent upon how many inmates over 60 are paroled.

60-69	\$3,492.81	1,239	\$2.82
70-79	\$4,117.95	303	\$13.59
80+	\$8,744.76	15	\$582.98

The Pardon & Parole Board, upon review of the measure, has found that the agency can absorb any costs related to stipulations in the bill.
