**Research Analysis**

HB 2322 includes firearm and ammunition components in the state preemption of legislation regarding such items. Allows persons adversely affected by any order, ordinance or regulation promulgated or enforced by a municipality or other political subdivision in violation of the preemption provisions to bring a civil action against the person, municipality or political subdivision. The measure requires the court to award reasonable expenses if the court grants a final determination in favor of the person adversely affected or if the order, ordinance or regulation in question is rescinded, repealed or otherwise abrogated after a lawsuit has been filed. The measure defines the terms “person adversely affected” and “reasonable expenses”.
