Research Analysis

HB 2323 modifies the manner in which firearms may be transported in vehicles. The measure any citizen, except a convicted felon, to transport an unloaded rifle or shotgun concealed or unconcealed at any time. The measure allows any citizen, except a felon, who is 21 or older to transport a pistol, concealed or unconcealed, loaded or unloaded without a valid handgun license issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act provided, the citizen is not involved in a crime. The measure prevents law enforcement officers from disarming or physically restraining any individual possessing a concealed or unconcealed weapon with having a reasonable and articulable suspicion of other criminal activity.
