## **Research Analysis**

The committee substitute stipulates that any licensee who is subject to the provisions of the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act will be deemed to have given consent to State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision investigators to access and inspect records to determine compliance with applicable narcotics and dangerous drug laws and regulations. Refusal to allow access may constitute grounds for denial, nonrenewal, suspension, or revocation of a license.

Additionally, the bill permits the Allied Professional Peer Assistance Program of the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to employ a director for purposes of ongoing nonclerical administrative duties and to fix the director's compensation. The program may contract with outside entities for services that it cannot provide or can be obtained for a lesser cost through such a contract.

## Fiscal Analysis
