**Research Analysis**

HB 2387 authorizes the Office of Juvenile Affairs (OJA) to assess which of two given options is the best value for a construction strategy. One option is to enter into an agreement with the Commissioners of the Land Office (CLO) and a public/private partnership for development and construction or refurbishment of a facility to provide secure care and specialty residential services. If this option is chosen, OJA may sell land at the Central Oklahoma Juvenile Center campus to the CLO. OJA is also authorized to sell bond obligations and generate up to \$45 Million for construction, improvement or refurbishment costs associated with a new campus. Finally, OJA is directed to develop plans for repurposing the Southwest Oklahoma Juvenile Center and the Oklahoma Juvenile Center for Girls campuses.
