**Research Analysis**

HB 2614 requires the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to create and maintain an Oklahoma Animal Abuse Offender Registry and website. District court clerks will forward to OSBI a copy of the judgment and sentence for those who violated the offenses listed in the measure, such as poisoning animals, instigating animal fights, cruelty to animals, and animal abandonment. Registrant information will be removed after two years if there are no other animal-abuse related convictions. Subsequent violations will result in five years on the registry.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2614 requires OSBI to create and maintain the Oklahoma Animal Abuse Offender Registry Act. According to OSBI, estimated costs include:

- Registry development: \$200,000 to \$300,000;
- Annual registry maintenance: \$3,600;
- Hiring of 1 FTE as a Registry Manager-Administrative Programs Officer II (E12A)  
~\$72,000 with benefits.

The total fiscal impact according to OSBI is: \$275,600 to \$375,600 for the initial startup costs and an additional \$75,600 for subsequent years.
