**Research Analysis**

HB 2821 transfers all duties and powers of the Board of Juvenile Affairs to the Executive Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs, and provides for the board to become an advisory body to the executive director. The measure authorizes the Governor to appoint the executive director, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2821 in its current form converts the Board of Juvenile Affairs to an advisor body and shifts powers and duties to the Executive Director of the agency. The measure also eliminates travel reimbursement for board members. Agency savings will occur as a result of the eliminated travel reimbursements.
