Impact:	Construction Industries Board: Nonappropriated Agency. Anticipated negative fiscal impact to agency.

Research Analysis

HB 2935 provides that no electrical journeyman or contractor may supervise more than three apprentice electricians. The measure also exempts Class 2 and Class 3 circuits from the requirements of electrical licensing as long as the work is performed in accordance with National Fire Protection Association requirements.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure clarifies the definition of electrical work, and places limitations of work that may be performed by certain electrical license classifications. HB 2935, as written would allow additional employees at a work site to continue performing the non-electrical work tasks which would allow more work to be done that would not count against the current ratio of electrical supervisor to employee.

The Oklahoma Construction Industries Board, a nonappropriated industry: anticipates HB 2935 will present opportunities for less license applications, resulting in anticipated fees to be lost to the agency and a negative fiscal impact.
