Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute to HB 3024 prohibits imposing a sentence of life imprisonment without the possibility of parole on any defendant who was less than 18 years of age at the time the offense was committed. The measure provides that a person who was convicted and sentenced for any offense committed before he or she was eighteen years of age and in which the death of another person did not occur, and that was committed before, on or after the effective date of this act, is eligible for release on parole no later than after serving twenty years of incarceration, unless by law the person is eligible for earlier parole eligibility. Any person who was convicted and sentenced for any offense committed before he or she was eighteen years of age, in which the death of another person occurred, and that was committed before, on or after the effective date of this act, is eligible for release on parole no later than after twenty-five years of incarceration, unless by law the person is eligible for earlier parole eligibility.
