Research Analysis

HB 3060 provides that if the OSBI requests the sheriff to conduct a criminal history records name search for the renewal application of an Oklahoma Self Defense Act license, the OSBI is to remit fifty percent of the renewal fee paid by the applicant to the sheriff. Fees collected by the sheriff for conducting a criminal history records name search at the request of the OSBI are to be retained by the sheriff and deposited into the Sheriff's Service Fee Account.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3060, upon review by OSBI has been determined to have a negative impact for the agency. The maximum revenue loss estimate for OSBI would be ~\$1.8 million (see below). The measure states that only in the situation where the OSBI requests the sheriffs to conduct the search will the agency have to remit 50% of the revenue. Since that does not occur in every instance, the exact revenue loss is unknown- it is contingent upon how many times the OSBI requests sheriffs to conduct the search.

We have 39552 Licensees eligible to renew between January and December 2018. Of these eligible to renew about 76% of the licensees will renew this year. Over the last 4 years, about 60% of the licensees renewed for a 5 year license.

39,552 * 76% = 30,060 renewal applications 60% (5 yr) = 18,036 * \$85 = \$1,533,060 40% (10 yr) = 12,024*\$170 = \$2,044,080

Total Revenue = \$3,577,140 Half of the total revenue = \$1,788,570
