**Research Analysis**

HB 3073 lowers from within 180 days to within 30 days the time at which a person released from the Department of Corrections to report to the district court of the county from which the judgment and sentence resulting in incarceration arose and any other court where the person owes fines, fees, costs and assessments. The measure also lowers from 180 days to 90 days after release, the period of time at which the person is not required to pay any outstanding fines, fees, costs or assessments.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3073 makes two major changes:

- 1) Lowers the time for released individuals to report to the district court- no fiscal impact.
- 2) Reduces the length of the grace period for repayment of fines and fees. Upon consultation with the Admin of the Courts (AOC), there is determined to be no fiscal impact. The AOC believes this will not affect the courts' collection levels nor will it increase dramatically the number of warrants issued.
