The committee substitute to HB 3120 provides that a defendant's ability to post bail may be considered by the court when determining if the defendant is eligible for appointment for indigent defense services, but may not be the sole factor in determining eligibility.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3120 could increase the workload of (and increase the costs for) the Oklahoma Indigent Defense System (OIDS). However, the actual impact would be dependent upon how this measure would increase the amount of defendants eligible for a public defender.

Currently, the average cost of one case litigated by OIDS is \$322.23 total.
