**Research Analysis**

The measure directs that in the case of the passage of a constitutional amendment that converted the offices of the State Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Commissioner of Labor, and Insurance Commissioner to appointed offices that each of those positions would serve in the governor's cabinet in the following capacity if the cabinet included:

- a secretary whose area oversees state financial of budgetary matters, that office will be filled by the State Treasurer;
- a Secretary of Education, the office will be filled by the Superintendent of Public Education;
- a Secretary of Labor, the office will be filled by the Commissioner of Labor; and
- a Secretary of Insurance, the office will be filled by the Insurance Commissioner.

The measure also authorizes the Lieutenant Governor to serve on the cabinet in a capacity determined by the governor.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3208 in its current form, provides that in the event statewide officers become appointments of the Governor, such officers will fill certain cabinet positions. The measure also clarifies the salary for such officers if they are also serving in a cabinet position. The salary clarifications within the measure align with the current applied policy related to state employees and officers being designated as cabinet members. For this reason the measure has no direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
