**Research Analysis**

The amendment creates two new subsections. Subsection C would authorize a sheriff's office that utilizes body cameras to establish, upon approval of the District Attorney, a video retention schedule that will consist of requirements for storing and keeping video or audio recordings from body cameras. Subsection D requires any written reports and records related to audio and video recordings to be kept for a minimum of seven years.
