**Research Analysis**

HB3282, as introduced, provides that individuals with disabilities are to be afforded equal housing opportunities and prohibits landlords from requiring extra compensation for accommodating a service animal that belongs to an individual with a disability. A housing accommodation may request proof of compliance with vaccination requirements and may hold the renter liable for any damage done to the premise or another person on the premise by a service animal.
