**Fiscal Analysis**

Officials from the Ethics Commission interpret the provisions of HB 3287 to result in no negative fiscal impact on the Commission. The measure provides for civil penalties ranging from \$100-200 per offense. In the event such penalties were collected such revenue would be retained by the Ethics Commission.
