**Fiscal Analysis**

The Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation (ODWC) anticipates a negative fiscal impact of \$246,229 at the end of 45 years. This loss, per the agency is a result of the lost annual revenue from the 40 additional licenses provided in this bill. This finding takes into account the interest income on the principal investment of \$75,000. The interest return on the initial payment does not cover the lost annual revenue.

- Per the ODWC, attaching a license to a specific tract of land into perpetuity would erode a fiscal interest of at least 3.5% growth each decade in lost license fees to the agency.
- Additionally, ODWC anticipates a negative annual impact, ranging from approximately \$20,000 - 30,000 for lost revenue of the 40 additional licenses that the measure provides to the landowner. The agency estimates are based from typical nonresident hunting license purchase scenarios.

This impact is contingent upon how many landowners opt to purchase lifetime licenses versus the purchase of annual licenses.
