**Research Analysis**

The PCS for HB 3400 directs DHS to remove the addresses of licensed child care facilities and homes listed on its public database but authorizes the use of a non-public database containing the addresses for law enforcement purposes. The measure also requires the department to appoint an administrative law judge (ALJ) to conduct a hearing within 72 hours upon receipt of a protest resulting from the revocation or denial of a child care facility license; modifies the time frame for giving notice of a hearing from two weeks to 24 hours; and requires that an individual to whom an emergency order was issued be given a hearing in front of an ALJ within 72 hours of the department's receipt of such a request.
