**Research Analysis**

The Committee Substitute to HB 3439 modifies DNA collection and test kit requirements by allowing the use of Rapid DNA testing. The measure requires DNA collectors who are not using Rapid DNA instruments and analysis to use sample kits provided by the OSBI, an accredited laboratory operating under contract with the OSBI or an accredited laboratory operated by a municipality or county. The measure requires any cost incurred for collecting and analyzing DNA at booking is to be paid by the convicted person. Upon completion of any DNA testing, except for Rapid DNA collected samples, the results and all data related to the testing are to be submitted to the OSBI Combined DNA Index System Database. Agencies using Rapid DNA testing must execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the OSBI defining the roles and responsibilities with each facility planning to establish a Rapid DNA booking station for enrollment of arrestees in the OSBI Combined DNA Index System Database.
