**Research Analysis**

The CS for HB 3555 changes, from reasonable suspicion to probable cause, the legal standard that must be met for taking a child into state custody, not releasing a child from emergency custody in the event an adjudication hearing is delayed, and for issuing a restraining order against an alleged perpetrator of abuse. The measure also establishes a procedure for the parent or legal guardian of a child to request a hearing prior to disposition seeking release of the child from emergency custody.
