Research Analysis

HJR1002 seeks a vote of the people to amend the Oklahoma Constitution to clarify justice and due process rights of victims. The protections offered by the measure would include the right to: privacy of the victim; reasonable and timely notice of all proceedings; be heard in any proceeding during which a right of the victim is at issue; reasonable protection; notice of any release or escape; refuse an interview, deposition or other discovery request made by the accused; full and timely restitution; proceedings free from unreasonable delay; and confer with the attorney for the government. The victim, lawful representative of the victim or the attorney for the government at the victim's request may assert and have enforced in any court or other authority the rights established in the Constitution or other right afforded by law.
