**Research Analysis**

SB 1008 adds soliciting, inducing or enticing another to commit prostitution and human trafficking to a list of crimes punishable by a misdemeanor and a fine for a first offense or a felony and a fine for second and subsequent offenses.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 1008 which adds human trafficking and certain types of prostitution to a list of crimes punishable by a misdemeanor and a fine (first offense) or a felony and a fine (second and subsequent offenses) increases the possibility of individuals being charged and convicted of the crime which could result in increased fine revenue and/or higher incarceration rates for the Dept. of Corrections (DOC). The ultimate fiscal impact is contingent upon how many individuals are convicted, the length of their sentence, and the amount of the fine they are required to pay. Currently it costs the DOC on average \$58.70/day or \$21,425.50/year to incarcerate one individual.
