Research Analysis

SB 1164 establishes procedures for the surrender of a driver license and provides for the mandatory revocation of driver license for certain offenses. The measure provides for the length of revocations. The measure prohibits the collection of multiple reinstatement fees. The measure provides for modifications by providing that as a condition of any modification, the person is required to have installed an ignition interlock device.

The measure repeals several sections of law ruled unconstitutional by *Hunsucker v. Fallin*:

Title 47, Section 6-204 relating to Order by Court to Surrender License to Department - Report of Conviction

Title 47, Section 6-205 relating to Mandatory Revocation of License by Department

Title 47, Section 6-205.1 relating to Duration of Revocation of Driver License or Driving Privilege

Title 47, Section 6-212 relating to Conditions for Reinstatement

Title 47, Section 754.1 relating to Modification of Revocation or Denial in Cases of Extreme and Unusual Hardship - Ignition Interlock Device
