Research Analysis

Engrossed SB1171 creates the Work-based Learning Program under the authority of the Governor's Council on Workforce and Economic Development. The measure directs the council to coordinate the program by creating partnerships with the State Department of Education, the State Regents for Higher Education, the State Department of Career and Technology Education, the Oklahoma Board of Private Vocational Schools, the Secretary of State and businesses throughout the state. The measure outlines the structure of the program and establishes procedures to register participating businesses as an active participant in the program. Registration can be done through the United States Department of Labor or through the office of the Secretary of State at a cost of \$50 for the first year and \$25 for each renewal year. The goal of the program is to generate at least 20,000 registered apprenticeship and internship positions by the end of 2020.

Fiscal Analysis

In its current form, the measure establishes a licensing fee structure that is anticipated to result in a budget neutral impact. The measure also creates a partnership between the State Department of Education, State regents for Higher Education, State Department of Career and Technology Education, and the Board of Private Vocational Schools. This partnership is not expected to result in a significant fiscal impact for these agencies.
