**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute to SB 1173 modifies the authorizations for wholesale license holders by removing language which prohibits wholesalers from purchasing in excess of 15% of inventory from one or more wholesalers. The measure allows a nonresident seller to transfer brand registration. The measure states legislative intent regarding the Twenty-first Amendment to the Constitution of the United States. The measure allows wine and spirits wholesalers to make certain designations regarding exclusive distributors. The measure modifies the duties of the director of ABLE by removing the ability of the director to refer evidence of violations of the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act to law enforcement. The measure establishes a “Designating Manufacturer License”. The measure allows a wholesaler to transport wine, spirits and beer in vehicles owned, leased or operated by the wholesaler. The measure provides that a manufacturer may designate different brands within its portfolio to a different wine and spirits wholesaler. The measure prohibits municipalities from enacting ordinances criminalizing conduct that may be prosecuted administratively by the ABLE Commission.

The measure repeals Title 37, Section 521 relating to Acts Authorized by the Various Licenses

The measure repeals Title 37, Section 573 relating to Registration of Labels - Fees
