**Research Analysis**

SB 1174 establishes limitations on new occupational fees or licensing regulations, including:

- Prohibiting a political subdivision of the state from imposing new fees or requirements on a new profession if that subdivision does not already impose fees or requirements on that profession;
- Capping occupational fees imposed by a political subdivision at \$25 per year;
- Prohibiting a political subdivision from imposing regulations on a profession beyond those required by a state agency with licensing authority; and
- Providing that new licensing restrictions imposed by the state upon a profession previously unregulated by the state supersede restrictions and regulations imposed by a political subdivision.

The measure also establishes a waiver of licensing fees for low-income individuals and military families.
