**Research Analysis**

The engrossed measure modifies the concurrent enrollment program for eligible high school students. Eligible seniors will be entitled to receive a tuition waiver equivalent to the amount of resident tuition for a maximum of eighteen credit hours. Subject to the program being fully funded, eligible high school juniors will be entitled to receive a tuition waiver equivalent to the amount of resident tuition for a maximum of nine credit hours in their junior year. The measure deletes the requirement that the state regents establish application criteria for prioritizing applicants based on need, timeliness of application, or other factors. Lastly, it directs the state regents to issue an annual report on the concurrent enrollment program by December 1 and to make it available on the regents and the State Department of Education websites.
