**Research Analysis**

SB 1211 prohibits the operation of a vehicle with a load that exceeds a height of 13 ½ feet unless a greater height is authorized by a special permit issued by the Commissioner of Public Safety.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 1211, which allows certain heights of vehicles to apply for a special permit from the Dept. of Public Safety, could increase the total amount of permits applied for and, as a result, increase revenue. The permits are an annual cost of \$4,000 each. The exact impact is contingent how many more permit applications are approved. The revenue goes to the Dept. of Transportation, Dept. of Public Safety, and other state entities.
