Research Analysis

The engrossed measure permits a provider enrolled in the state's Medicaid program to bill the Oklahoma Health Care Authority for services performed up to one year after the date of service. If a claim is initially denied, the provider may submit a subsequent claim up to one year after the original claim was denied; however, the provider may use this provision once per claim.

Fiscal Analysis

SB 1372 allows, to the extent under federal law that any provider enrolled in the state Medicaid program, be able to bill the Oklahoma Health Care Authority for Medicaid services performed up to one year after the date of service was performed and that if a claim is initially denied, the provider may submit a subsequent claim up to one year after the original date of denial.

From the Oklahoma Health Care Authority:

Federal regulation (42 CFR 447.45) states that, "The Medicaid agency must require providers to submit all claims no later than 12 months from the date of service."
